- ◆ Provides community supervision for eligible individuals
- ◆ Provides an alternative to incarceration for individuals awaiting a court disposition

Native Services (Adult & Youth)

- ◆ Services delivered in culturally relevant manner
- ◆ Supervision of adult provincial probation, parole & community service orders
- ◆ Probation supervision and community service orders for aboriginal youth ages 12-17

Direct Accountability Program

- ◆ An alternative program to prosecution for eligible individuals over the age of 18 who have been charged with minor criminal offences.
- ◆ Programming Options include: The Stop Shop Theft, Alcohol & Drug and Anger Management programs.
